- **Stunning Skies:** The Island's open horizons provide a magnificent canvas for breath-taking, uninterrupted sunrises and sunsets.

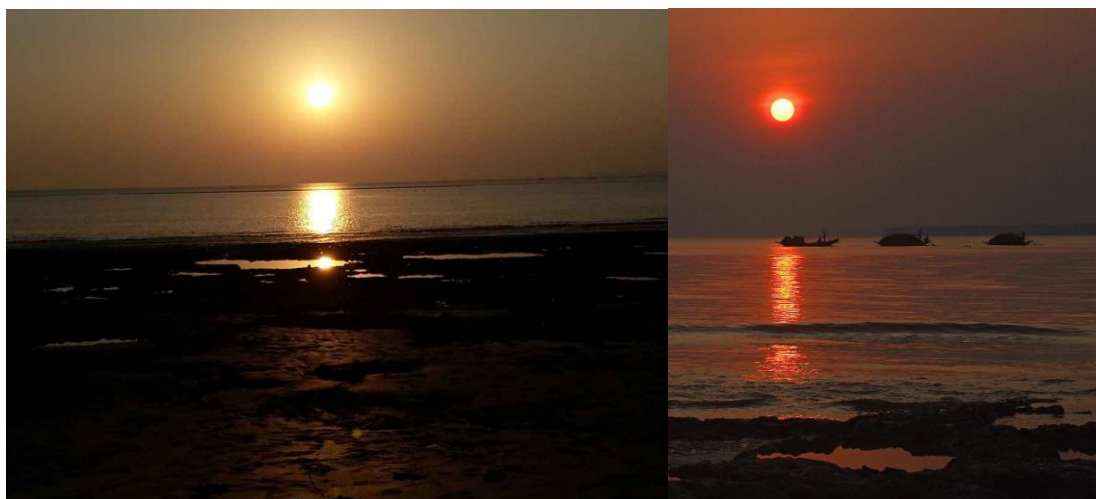


Figure 2: Scenic beauty of island.

- **Eco-Camping Experience:** Accommodation mainly consists of beachside tents and wooden cottages, providing an immersive nature experience.

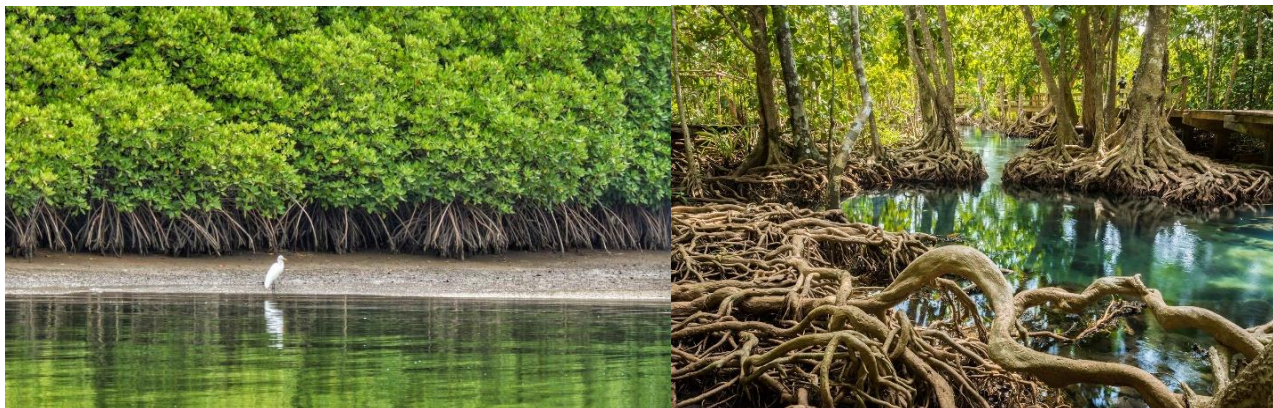


Figure 4: Mangrove forest of Mousuni Island.

Accessibility: Accessible from Kolkata via road up to Namkhana/Baganga Ghat, followed by boat crossings.

To reach the pristine beaches of Mousuni Island, you must take a quick ferry across the river. While standard passenger motorboats are primarily used for this island crossing, tourists can also arrange private big boat rides or charter fishing boats to explore nearby areas like Jambu Dwip. The Route: Drive or take a bus from Kolkata to Namkhana. Cross the Hatania-Doania bridge, then head to a ferry point like Durgapur Ghat.

The Crossing: Board a passenger ferry (locally called bhutbhuti or motorboat) to cross the Chinai River and reach Mousuni Island.

Once on the island, the "big boat" experience mainly revolves around sightseeing and local flavour:

Island Hopping: You can hire local fishermen's boats or arrange with your campsite to take a larger boat to nearby Jambu Dwip (a secluded, nearby island).

Fishing & Sunset Cruises: Many beach camps (such as Baliara or Bagdanga) can organize scenic boat rides for your group where you can watch the sunset from the water.

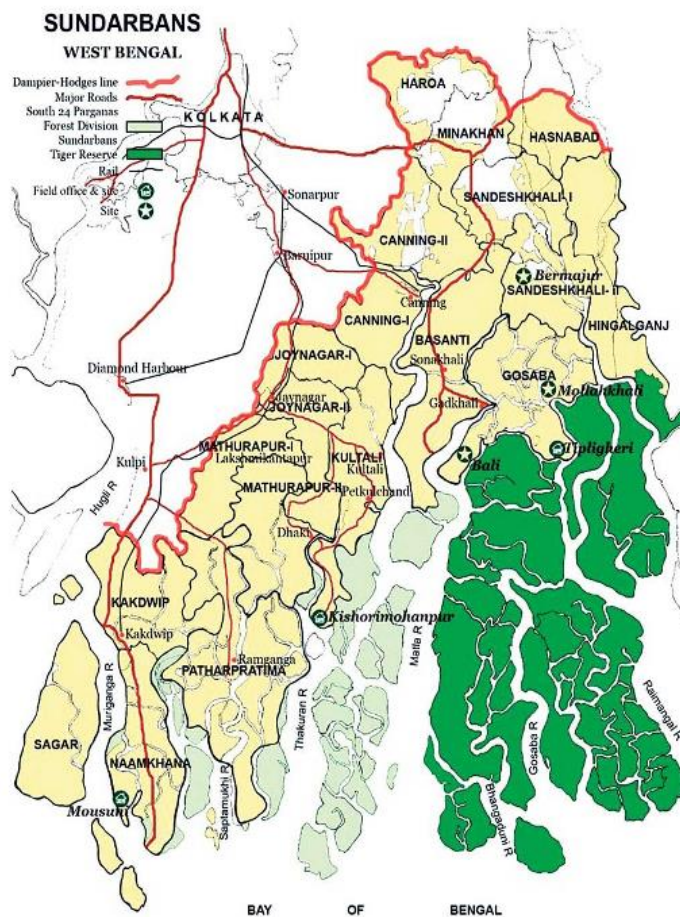


Figure 6: Map of Mousuni Island.

Eco-Stay: The Island is known for offbeat, rustic camping. Most beach camps offer tents and mud huts.

Best Time to Visit: Winter months (October to February) are the best, as the weather is cool and perfect for boat rides and beach walk.

The Hatania-Doania River is a tidal creek located in the South 24 Parganas district of West Bengal, India, separating Namkhana from Narayanpur. It is a critical waterway for connectivity in the Sundarbans region. A high-level extradosed bridge (Hatania-Doania Bridge) on NH-117 now connects these banks, enhancing transport to Bakkhali.

Key Details

Location: Namkhana, South 24 Parganas, West Bengal, India.

Significance: Separates Namkhana (north bank) from Narayanpur (south bank).

Bridge: The Hatania-Doania Bridge (also known as Namkhana Bridge) was built to replace the previous ferry/vessel service.

Nature: It is part of the tidal creeks of the Sundarban delta system.

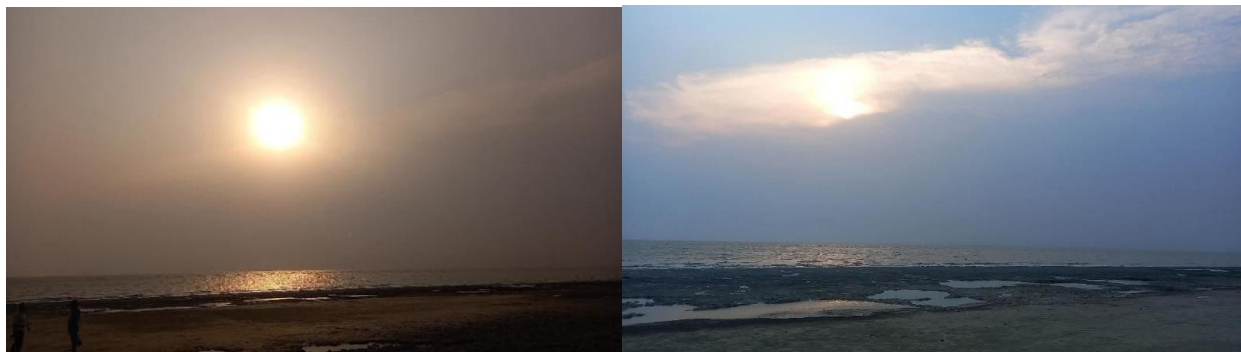


Figure 7: Ethnic view of Mousuni Island.
